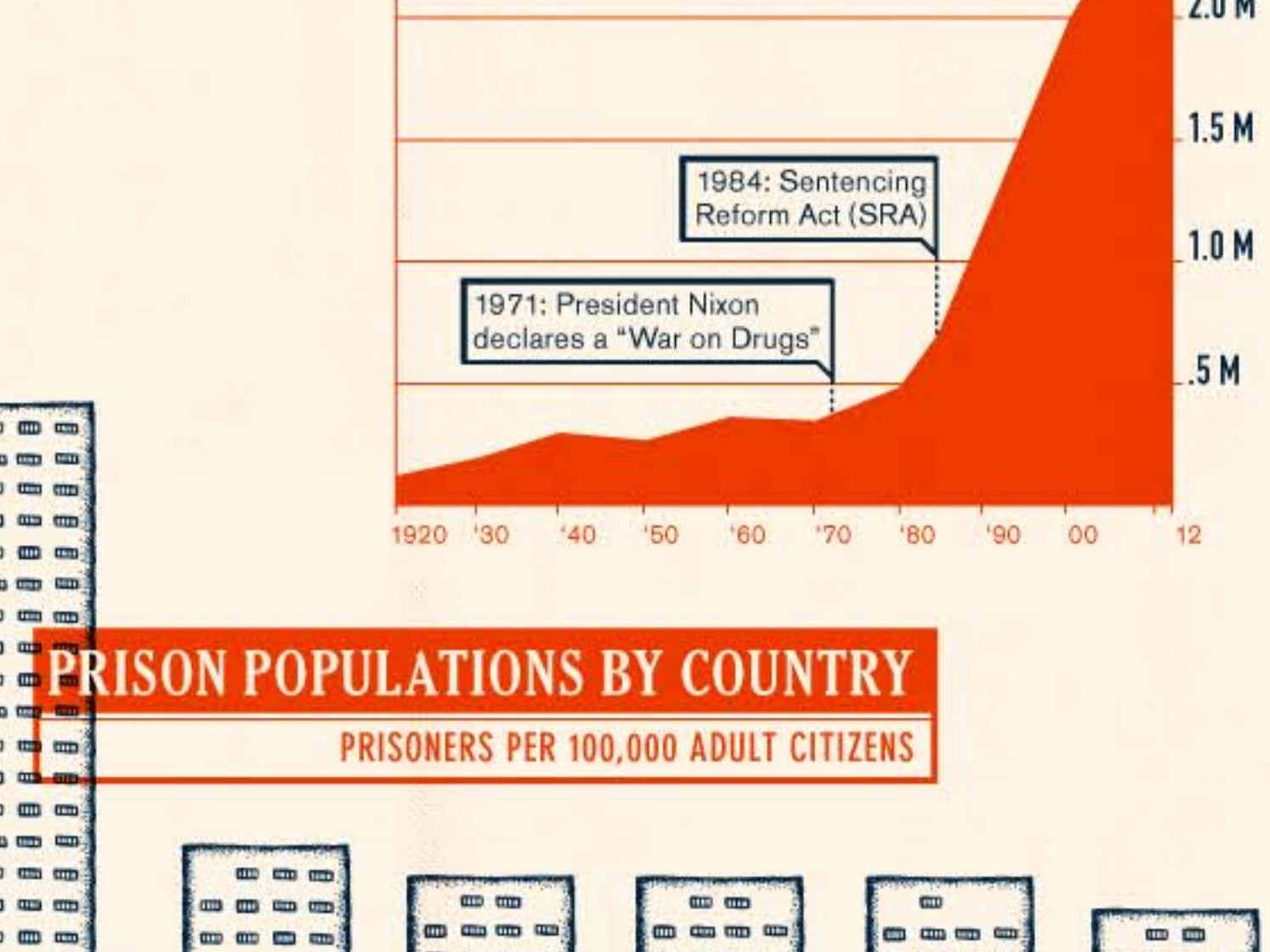

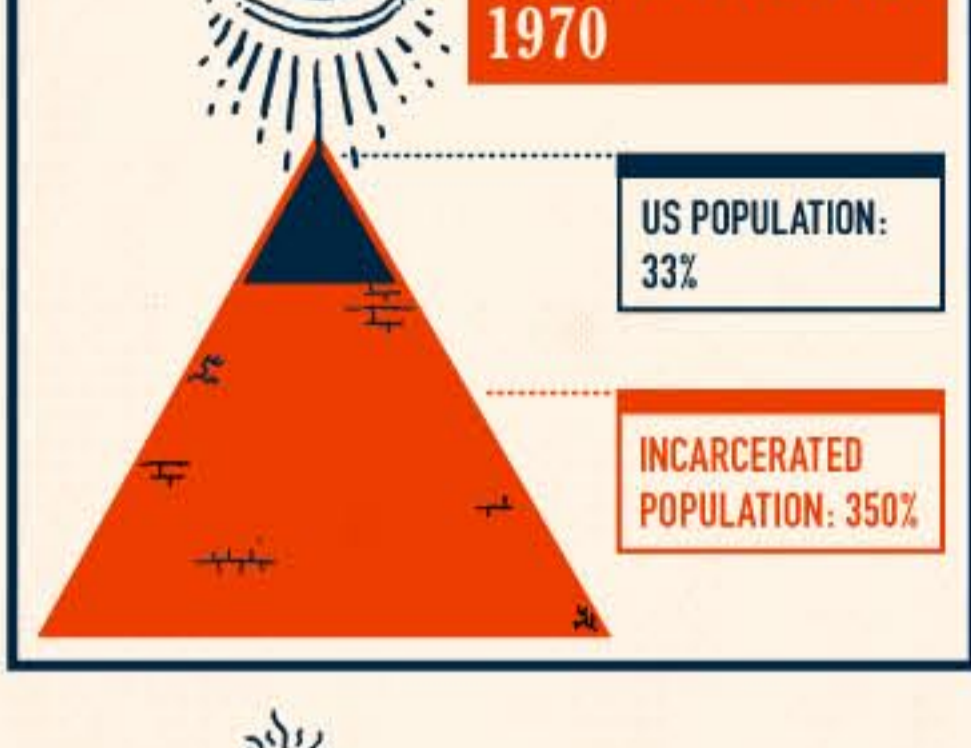
## The Problem

DESPITE A 41% DECREASE IN VIOLENT CRIME SINCE 1990, INCARCERATION RATES HAVE SOARED.

## The Cause

THE FAILED WAR ON DRUGS: KEEPING PRISONS AT CAPACITY

OVER THE PAST 40 YEARS, The U.S. has spent over \$1 trillion on the war on drugs. ENOUGH TO PAY THE ENTIRE NATION'S STUDENT DEBT

### NON-VIOLENT DRUG OFFENDERS AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE PRISON POPULATION



ANNUALLY 1.7 MILLION AMERICANS ARE ARRESTED ON DRUG CHARGES

TRIPLE THE AMOUNT OF VIOLENT CRIME ARRESTS

4 of 5 Drug arrests are for simple possession.

### AS INCARCERATION RATES SKYROCKET, PRIVATE PRISONS RAKE IN PROFITS.



THE TOTAL NUMBER OF PRISON INMATES: **+16%**

THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN PRIVATE FEDERAL PRISONS: **+120%**

Inmates in private prisons cost taxpayers \$1,600 more per year.

At the same time, inmates are used for labor - paying them 23 cents an hour.

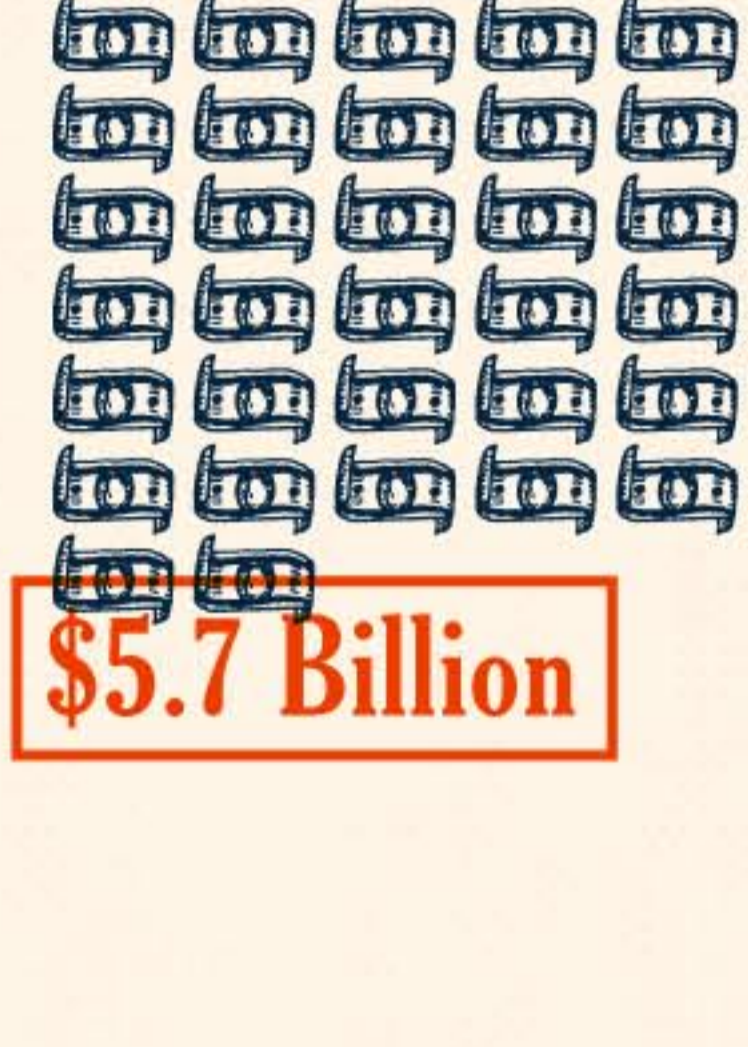

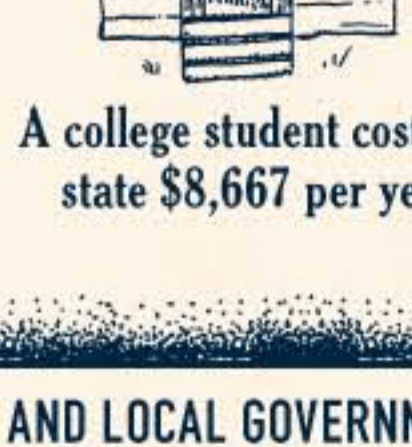
## The Impact

CALIFORNIA SPENDS MORE ON PRISONS THAN EDUCATION

California Spending, 2011 IS \$100 MILLION



SINCE 1980 CALIFORNIA HAS BUILT ONE COLLEGE CAMPUS AND 21 PRISONS.



A college student costs the state \$8,667 per year.



A prisoner costs it \$45,006 a year.

FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS SPEND \$75 BILLION IN TAXPAYER MONEY ON INCARCERATION A YEAR.

LIFETIME COST PER PRISONER **\$1.2 MILLION**



COST TO INSTITUTE THE DEATH PENALTY **\$3 MILLION** (due to appeals and processes)

The money that states spend on prisons has risen at six times the rate of spending on higher education in the past 20 years.
