Worship Planning Notes

For Homecoming this year, consider having members dressed in clothing from eras of long ago. Have various members speak throughout the service and provide church history for the era for which they are clothed. For instance, members may dress in attire from the 1850s, 1920s, 1950s, 1970s, and today.

If your church is a new church, consider hosting a picnic or church dinner that encompasses southern cuisine and evokes images of old homecoming celebrations.

are not with us today because they now reside in Paradise. Thank you for their lives. We now stand

on their shoulders.

All: Throughout this service and celebration our ultimate

aim is to give you glory. You are worthy of our

highest praise. Amen and Amen.
