## **Worship Planning Notes**

- Encourage your congregation to realize that their behavior and attitudes in the workplace reflect upon their discipleship. They should take God with them as they go about their daily work routines.
- Worship planners should work to ensure that this is a celebration of work. Screens should display work Scriptures. The bulletin/order of worship should contain information to help persons who need work.
- Consider planning a job fair either on this day after worship or on Saturday, September 5. Do not do it alone. Work with other churches, city entities, unions, and schools. Make it big. Your community needs it.

Warning against Idleness	
Leader:	Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us.
Congregation:	For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it;
Leader:	But with toil and labor we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you.

Congregation: This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate.

Leader: For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat.

# Congregation: For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work.

Leader: Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living.

## Together: Brothers and sisters do not be weary in doing what is right.
